


Gift Shop Re-Name Now Official

Deep Space Comes to Thompson Hall On Wednesday August 3

Guest Speaker-Mr. William O'Neil



Mr. O'Neil will give us a fast-paced overview of Jet Propulsion Lab's lunar and planetary robotic missions. He participated in several missions including the first soft landings on the moon and the Galileo tour of Jupiter. His presentation will include slides of the spacecraft and ground systems that executed these missions, as well as the historic and spectacular images from the missions themselves.

His assignments at Jet Propulsion Lab's have included missions to the Moon, Jupiter and its moon Europa, planet Mars and asteroids Gaspra and Ida. These projects have familiar names like Surveyor and Galileo.

He has been honored with NASA's highest award—the Distinguished Service Medal—for his management of Project Galileo.

Bill and his wife, Diane, moved to Atascadero from the Los Angeles area in 2007.




