


Prez Sez. . .

CURATOR FINDS





C-47 Status per crewman John Doyle:

There is continuing progress. A test flight is scheduled for the weekend of March 16. The rain has contributed to some lost time. Some new communications gear will be installed down at San Luis Obispo (new radios) on March 18. Then it is down to Santa Maria for some touch up work on the paint. The working crew will be with the C-47 during all of these off-site procedures. The plan is to finish up everything by the end of April.

There is an intricate and adventuresome flight plan for this coming journey further into history. *Betsy's Biscuit Bomber* will depart Paso Robles around May 4 and head to Chino, CA for the air show there and then head for a stop in Kansas prior to heading for the Carolinas, New York and Connecticut for crew training in formation flying. **Scott Stelzle** motors the new STARBORD (right side) engine into the install area for testing/evaluation. It took the better part of a day to figure out how to best load it onto the fork for precise positioning when lifted to the exact points of attachment.

She then will depart the U.S. by way of Nova Scotia, Greenland, Iceland and on to Scotland and U.K., ultimately landing in Duxsford, England, the muster point for all Skytrains/Dakotas taking part in the operation: the re-enactment of the D-Day landing.

From Normandy she will fly to Berlin to re-enact the Berlin Airlift. Then it is back to England to proceed home the way she came. Picture the landing, taxi up and shut-down back in its place at EWM after all this!

This is a "Bucket List" trip for the "Gooney Bird" members and anyone even remotely associated with Betsy's Biscuit Bomber since its arrival at EWM. This writer trusts that this same C-47 will be around to drop paratroopers on the 100th anniversary of the beginning of the end of WWII. Who will make up the crew then?
