
TREASURE TROVE OF RACING BOOKS FOR THE GIFT SHOP IN TIME FOR THE HOLIDAYS.

Perfect for the race fan for Christmas, Birthday, etc.



"We went in two groups. The "slow" planes (Brad's Stearman, the I-16 Bug smasher, and George's L-5) flew over the Paso Robles Cemetery, then over the ceremony in Atascadero. The "fast" group (Jeff Quaid's SNJ T6, the T-28 and T-34) did the same then continued on to fly over the Los Osos cemetery."
