I mentioned last month that we have a donor for infrastructure improvements to the newly leased property west of the museum. We are in the process of determining where the water, gas, sewer and electrical lines will locate as well as identifying any limita-



tions as to where we can place buildings. We expect that by this time next year we will be in a position to start putting up buildings. Paying for infrastructure has been a major roadblock for developing this property. Today we are down to but a speed bump.

The first construction you might see will be at the south end of Freedom Hall. We are adding 25 feet to the building for curator storage. Every museum has this common problem: having more items to display than space to display them. Dr. Jill Thayer has been dealing with this since she joined us. Finally we are able to give her some relief! This will move the 3 existing parking spaces to the west. Eventually we plan to do some improvements to the lawn area between the addition and Thomson Hall.

Communication is critical for the successful operation of any organization. Again, I invite you to attend the Board of Directors meetings the third Wednesday of every month. Next one is November 20th. This is where key decisions are made. Your input on these decisions is important. Likewise, keep an eye on the calendar in our website for other museum events. If there is a question about when we are open, or where you can volunteer, the answer is there.

C-47 On Scenic PR Ride to Air Show Oct. 5th



Betsy's Biscuit Bomber took an afternoon stroll over to Sedona, AZ for an appearance at the Sedona Family Fun Day / Wings and Wheels Airshow on October 5. The event, sponsored by local Sedona businesses and the Airport Authority, welcomed the "Bomber" and "Executive Sweet" the B-25 Mitchell from Camarillo and other warbirds from around the Southwestern USA. Estrella members Tom and Mary Ann Gorham were on hand for the Meet And Greet and took a few photos to pass on. The Airport Authority had this to say about it in their flyer: "Warbird and aviation enthusiasts will get an exclusive look at one of the restored C-47 Dakota (military version of the DC-3) aircraft that traveled to Europe and back to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of D-Day and the 70th Anniversary of the Berlin Airlift. The C-47 known as "Besty's Biscuit Bomber" will fly to Sedona from its home in Paso Robles, California. 
