


Claudia Woodland and the new addition to WAD: A 1948 Lincoln Continental Convertible

efforts. As for the rest of us: Help Mr. Harris wage a winning war against these invaders. Pick a weed and put it in a trash can.




Oh, By The Way...

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


80,000 employees with 12,000 products and annual sales of \$12 billion with facilities in 13 states and four nations through his tenure.

Brouhaha Over OV-10?


There has been a lot of "discussion" amongst those who value the military aircraft exhibits we have on display here at EWM. These discussions are legitimate as to the detail that is needed to make up any one display as "accurate". This always leads to what IS and what IS NOT "accurate". How will the public see this exhibit?

Now, these discussions can, at times be "spirited", when good minds toss back and forth legit opinions. We at EWM have real experts at looking up details about proper sinage/livery on every aircraft standing on this campus. Today's case: The OV-10 Bronco.

This newsletter learned after good research that our Bronco may have been a Marine. A few Broncos did serve with the Marine Corp....Just not our Bronco.

Dennis Johansen and Jason Holland both researched the faint bureau number on the airplane with the Bronco Association and Government records. They have determined that the airplane you see in the shop now will be in Gray U. S. Air Force livery after all. Look at the Tropic Lightning News on display in Freedom Hall. Dennis' photo of the Bronco being delivered to CuChi in 1968 will show what the Bronco scheme is. So, the "discussion" is settled:
