

Takeoff:

Start engines at 9:35am hours, takeoff at 9:45m hours on 123.00 Unicom. Flight leader Eagle 1 will call for change of frequency to 122.75 leaving pattern.


Eagle 1, 2 & 3 will climb to 2,000-ft and proceed to an area 3 miles North of Atascadero and in line with El Camino Blvd. Flight will form formation at 1,800-feet (1,000 feet AGL) and head South making a gradual descent to fly down El Camino over the downtown park at exactly 9:55am. Flight will do a 180-degree turn South of Atascadero and fly North down El Camino flying over parade start at 10:00am.

Return to Paso Robles Airport:

Eagle 1, 2 and 3 will climb to 1,800-feet. Each aircraft will proceed back to the Paso Robles Airport. All aircraft will return to 123.00 before entering PRB traffic pattern.

All aircraft will land separately.



Do you know that Travel Advisor and Yelp rank our museum as the best area attraction outside of the wine industry in Paso Robles? I want to share with you exciting highlights of 2017 and provide a sense of our strategic goals for 2018, goals we hope to achieve with the help of our loyal donors and volunteers.

The year 2017 saw the conclusion of three years of negotiations with the City of Paso Robles when we signed a 40 year lease for an adjacent ten acres. This affords the opportunity for a dramatic expansion of the museum, including additional display space (we have more artifacts than room to show them) and the construction of additional hangars in which to house our aircraft. There is nothing more disheartening than watching a meticulously restored airplane sit and bake under the summer sun. The new hangars will help preserve these wonderfully restored aircraft, and could in include donor name recognition on the building.

During 2017 the restoration crew completed magnificent restorations of an extremely rare US Navy F9F reconnaissance jet and a US Army H-19 Chickasaw helicopter which saw service in Korea, and (as I draft this letter) the final touches are being applied to a Marine Corps H-34 Chocktaw which served in Vietnam. Come out and see the planes!

2017 witnessed a successful combined Warbirds Wings & Wheels Car Show and Mega Swap Meet. This attracted 250 exhibitors and well over 3,000 visitors. Also, aviation legend Dick Rutan – he flew around the world nonstop – visited the museum and donated a large portion of his personal library to the museum.

In 2018 we want to build on this momentum and achieve:

- Hangar Construction
- Museum Solar Project
- Added Display Space
- Increase our Visitor Count with emphasis on Education
