#### **Hearst Foundation Matching Challenge**

Regular readers of the newsletter will recall that the **Hearst Foundation** generously contributed

\$100,000 to the museum in December. That donation coupled with the success of our end of the year appeal letter -- 57 donors contributed over \$26,000 (including two incredibly generous



donations of \$10,000 each; one from Ed Chidlaw and one from an anonymous donor) -- prompted us to initiate the Hearst Foundation Matching Challenge. We're off and running. In addition to the \$26,000, Travel Paso has agreed to support Warbirds, Wings & Wheels 10/Mega Swap Meet with a \$5,000 grant (thank Sue Dollymore for a persuasive grant request). And, in addition, the West Coast Stock Car Hall of Fame generously donated \$5,000 to be used for a public address system. So we're barely two months into 2018 and we're one-third the way to matching the Hearst Foundation grant. If you can think of additional ways to raise funds, we're all ears!

Here is a short history of the H-34 Helicopter project - quest for parts:

- 1. Purchased H-34 from airline pilot from Long Beach.
- 2. Air Frame was at Fox Field (Lancaster, Ca)
- 3. Loaded and trucked to Paso.
- 4. Short some parts searched the internet
- 5. Found some parts from Minter Field Museum (Bakersfield area) 3 trips, purchased landing gear, various small parts they had extra of. The restoration crew had to take parts off the air frame that was at this museum.
- 6. When back to Minter Field Museum and purchased the H-34 engine there. Trip #4.
- 7. Tom got a lead at Travis Air Museum, that they were going to scrap an H-34 there. Tom went up and got some more parts that were needed.

**EWM Feb 10**— It is official. Work has finally started on the **TA-4**. **Dennis Johansen** tests out his elbows




on the windscreen above. Wayne (Grinder) Rice, who flew this very airplane back in flight-training days, peers into the
