



Dennis J, Gary C, Palm Springs, and an F-18 Driver Named Chris. Swap and Trade Resto Style:



He was able to put makes and models on most of them just by looking...great info. One of them, he said, was a very early (**1950's**) **Martin-Baker seat** and was very desirable. We researched it and while don't know where it came from, it was EWM's property, so we **traded** it to him for the tanks and hard points.
