A-7 Corsair

FYI: The LTV A-7 Corsair II is a carrier-capable subsonic light attack aircraft designed and manufactured by American conglomerate Ling-Temco-Vought (LTV). The A-7 was developed during the early 1960's, as replacement for the Douglas A-4 Skyhawk. (EWM has 2 of those). Its design is derived from the Vought F-8 Crusader (EWM has 1 of those); in comparison with the F-8, the A-7 is both smaller and restricted to subsonic speeds. 

Dispatches From Dick Woodland

This beautifully restored #32 NASCAR Winston Cup racecar arrived Sunday 11/1/2020, during the broadcast of the current race at Martinsville, Virginia. Interesting in that one of its victories happened to be at Martinsville with Ricky Craven at the wheel.

This car was originally built for Robert Yates Racing and made its debut with a podium finish at Taladega, Alabama, in 1999 with Dale Jarret driving. (Dale Jarret won the NASCAR driving championship that year.)

The car was eventually sold to PPI Racing owned by Cal Wells. In 2001, Ricky Craven became the driver of the #32 and won 2 races in it, Martinsville, VA and Darlington, SC.

The #32 is owned by Mark Atchison and on loan to the Woodland Auto Display for 1 year.

The Bud Kaeding Championship winning Silver
Crown USAC car, is a unique addition to the Woodland Auto
Display. The attached description should answer any questions about the 29 car, but this gives us 2 types of Silver Crown cars on display; one a strictly Dirt Car and the other



strictly pavement. Both won National Championships in their day. The pavement car helped Bud Kaeding win 2 of his 3 championships, (these cars only ran for those 2 years), and the #4 dirt car was driven to a National Championship by now retired NASCAR Superstar, Jeff Gordon. The #29 car arrived at its new home this morning, 10/13/20.

Veteran's Day Salute Over Atascadero

Pilots George Marrett (L-5E), Wayne Rice (T-34), Scott Stelzle (J-5)

Crew positions:

Eagle 1: J-5 Cub Scott Stelzle (lead)

Eagle 2: L-5E Sentinel George Marrett (right wing & missing man)

Eagle 3: T-34 Wayne Rice (left wing)

Briefing:

Museum Hangar 1000

Takeoff:

Eagle 1, 2, & 3 will start engines at 10:25am, takeoff at 10:30am on 123.00 Unicom. After takeoff flight leader will transmit on radio for change to frequency 122.75 tactical.

Flyby:

Flight will proceed to Atascadero Veteran's Memorial via Santa Barbara Road/Hwy 101 intersection at 2,000-feet, depart intersection on heading of northwest and descend so as to arrive overhead memorial at exactly 11:00am. Eagle 2 will make the missing man pull up.

Return to Paso Robles airport:

Climb and proceed north bound to the Paso Robles airport. Leader will call frequency change back to 123.00 before entering pattern.

Landing:

Flight will enter pattern as individual aircraft. Each pilot will call on radio that they have landed and clear of runway. After last aircraft has stopped, all aircraft will taxi to fuel pit or museum.

Emergency procedures:

If leader aborts, Eagle 3 will take over lead. If Eagle 2 aborts, Eagle 3 will move to right wing and make the pull up. If Eagle 3 aborts, continue flight as briefed.

Emergency Radio procedures:

If Eagle 1's radio fails, Eagle 3 will take over communication. If Eagle 2 or 3 has radio problems, continue flight as briefed.

Debriefing:

Museum hangar, 15 minutes after landing.

he significance of the #21 Sprint Car is that it was owned by National Sprint Car Hall of Fame inductee, Ken Woodruff, when he wrenched it to victory at the World Of Outlaws inaugural race on 3/18/78 at the Devil's Bowl Speedway in Mesquite, Texas. (It was driven that day by fellow Hall of Famer and Calif. resident, Jimmy Boyd.)

The #21 Sprint Car is one of the most photographed cars in the Woodland collection and one of the most recognized Sprint Cars on a national level. It is truly an honor to be able to fulfill the Woodruff family's wishes.

Great things are happening on the EWM campus! Here are just a few keeping us busy! FREEDOM HALL EXPANSION/CURATORIAL

FREEDOM HALL EXPANSION/CURATORIAL ARCHIVAL FACILITY FUNDRAISER!

Our 1,000 sq. ft. Curatorial Archival Facility continues to evolve with framing and wiring finished, and drywall and painting underway! We are currently fundraising for what is needed in the interiors to move our archival collection into this new storage space. Our goal is \$18,000. Funds will be allocated to: flooring, lighting fixtures, storage cabinets, industrial metal storage units, containers for artifacts, protective coverings for the uniforms, a staging table, a conference table and chairs, vertical and flat files for artwork, and a cedar-lined closet featuring a 2-tier rail system that will span 25ft. on the west wall of the building. The closet will accommodate the museum's historical collection of military uniforms, boots, hats, helmets, gear, and accessories.
