

Three-year old *Estrella Squadron of the Confederate Air Force* put on their first air show on May 23, 1993. The fifty odd members recruited aircraft such as the World War II BT-13, T-6, P-51 and a British Spitfire to thrill a big crowd at the Paso Robles airport. The USAF, USN and USMC assisted the show with flybys of the huge Lockheed C-5A Galaxy, P-3 Orion and 2 AV-8 Har-

riers. Obbie Atkinson interviewed squadron volunteers and they explained their job.

We just received a donation to begin repainting our buildings, starting with Thomson Hall. More is needed.

The Board of Directors is responsible for setting goals to meet our mission, establishing the budget and overseeing the Museum's growth. The departments are the part that make it happen.

Donations and what we earn by the hard work of our staff and members is what keeps the Estrella Warbirds Museum open. Again, only through the work of our volunteers do we have a museum. I can't thank you enough.

# "New" Chopper On Way To EWM! Aerospatiale/Eurocopter Alouette III Model SA319B (1974)


# Donor: Mr. Wayne Fulton
