Briefing:

Museum Hangar 1000 HOURS Takeoff:

Start engines at 1035 hours, takeoff at 1050 hours on 123.00 Unicom. Flight leader Eagle 1 will call for change

Flyby:

Eagle 1 and 2 will proceed to truck stop North of the city of Paso Robles at 2,000 feet and orbit to the left. Flight will join up at 1057 hours for flight Southwest to Paso Robles Cemetery arriving overhead at exactly 1100. Eagle 2 will be the missing man and pull up and to the right crossing each service. Formation will turn right and fly South down Spring Street to Templeton Cemetery arriving at 1104. After flyby flight will proceed down Highway 101. Formation will continue South to Santa Margarita Cemetery arriving about 1114. Flight will climb to 2,500-ft, switch to 124.00 and orbit over "the Grade." Then descend heading South parallel to Hwy 101 to SLO Veterans Memorial building on Grant Street arriving at 1122. Then turn Southwest to intercept Los Osos Valley Road flying over Los Osos Memorial Park at exactly 1130. Flight will turn North bound, climb over mountains and head to Atascadero Veterans Memorial and flyby at 1200 (noon). Flight will breakup, climb and head toward Paso Robles Airport.

Return to Paso Robles Airport:

Climb and proceed to Paso Robles Airport. Leader will call frequency change back to 123.00 before entering traffic pattern.

Landing:

Eagle 1, 2 and 3 will land separately.

Debriefing:

Museum hangar, 15 minutes after landing.

Emergency Radio procedures:

If Eagle 1's radio fails, Eagle 2 will take over communication.
