PRAC Gets Close Up Look At Front Line Bombers In Wildfire Fight: CalFire Strategic Attack Aircraft

Students in the Paso Robles
Aviation Youth Program (Paso Robles
Aviation Club) under the direction of
Brad Eaton (center) toured the Paso
Robles Cal Fire Air Attack Base at Paso
Robles airport on Saturday,
September 4, 2021.

This Program offers middle and high school students the opportunity to pursue their interests in aviation as a pilot, mechanic, avionics tech, air traffic controller, or other. Past visits to the field have included Lemoore Naval Air Station, the San Luis Obispo Airport control tower and the California Highway Patrol Aviation Facility, all at the Paso Robles Airport.


These lucky students got a close-up look at *Air Attack 340 which flies the dual-seat OV-10 Bronco, and Tanker 75, an S-2 Tracker,* both former military aircraft. (See Estrella's Bronco AND Tracker) They heard how the Bronco is used as an air traffic control platform observing a wildfire, drawing tactics for fighting it from the air, and coordinating retardant drops (bombing runs) by the S-2 and/or other assets assigned to the action. The Air Tactical Officers (ATC) emphasized that this job includes advising Cal Fire "ground troops" for their own safety.


S-2 Tracker pilot Dave Skopet (2nd from left) spoke of the airplane's capabilities. The S-2 is the fastest initial attack tanker. It carries 1,200 gallons of retardant, a slurry mix of water, fertilizer (what!?), clay, and a red colorant. It can reach a wildfire from any one of Cal Fire's 13 bases in the state within 20 minutes. For you HS seniors and those who are looking at aviation jobs: The pilots explained that they work for DynCorp (HQ McClean, VA) and are contract pilots for CAL FIRE. They said their jobs generally require about 5,000 hours of flight experience to combat wildfires from the air.

Do your math/physics homework and get plenty of on the job training (OJT). Opportunities abound right here on Central Coast, CA.!



One of the most famous stock car racing photos of the last century, July 4, 1984 to be exact, is that of "The King" Richard Petty heading for victory in the Firecracker 400 at Daytona Beach, Florida while adjacent to the back straightaway is Daytona International Airport where President Ronald Reagan was landing in Air Force One.

This was Richard Petty's 200th and final victory of his career. President Reagan, a former radio sports announcer, went directly to the broadcast booth where he announced most of the remainder of the race to the sellout crowd and afterward dined with the drivers and crew members.

The 1984 Pontiac driven to victory by Richard Petty that day will be on display at the Woodland Auto Display as of September 1, 2021. It's not a replica but the authenticated car Richard Petty drove that day.
